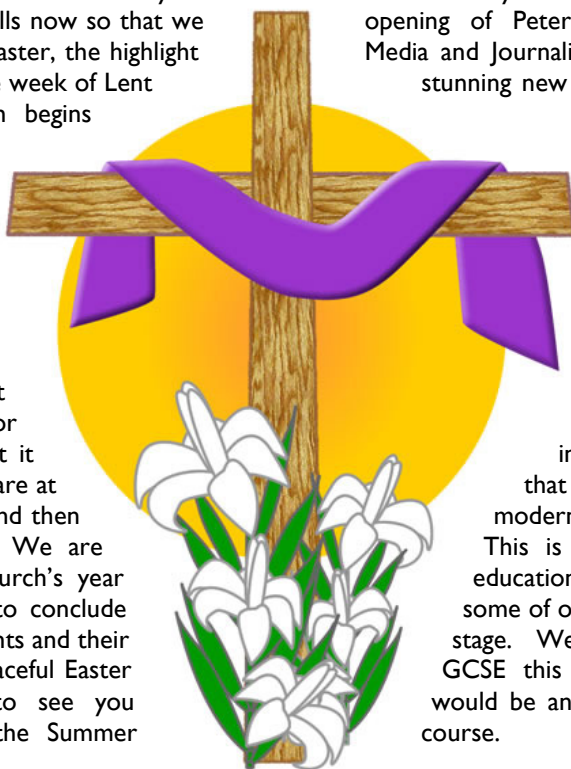


## Holy Week and Easter
