Faculty: Expressive Arts Subject: Music – Year 8



## Faculty Introduction:

The Music department is a well resourced department consisting of two large teaching spaces all equipped with keyboards and Sibelius. Three good sized practice rooms equipped with pianos and drum kits. There is also a recording studio 'MAC room' housing state of the art Apple recording suite to be used by music students from year 9 upwards. Individual instrumental lessons with high quality visiting peripatetic teachers covering singing, piano, woodwind, guitar and drums.



# Topics/Modules to be covered in the year:

#### Singing

Keyboard skills: more complex pieces; using simple chords to match points in songs —on Keyboard, Ukulele and Guitar Recorder: revisiting skills and extending range; Composing pieces based on short motifs; Extended use of elements of music — including wider range of timbre; Written work: reinforcing knowledge of treble stave and introducing Bass stave; reading more complex rhythms/musical maths. Group-work — exploring extension activities.

Computer: extending Sibelius software skills. Simple improvisation over ostinato.

#### Assessment:

Continuous assessment.
All assessments contribute to the end of year National curriculum level.
