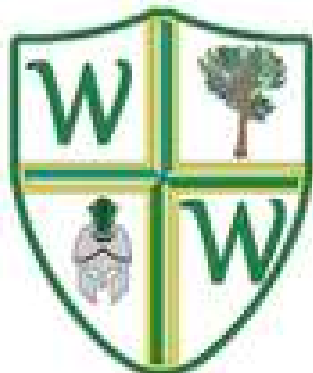


Champions League Attendance

Holocaust Poetry Workshop

On Tuesday a group of nine year 12 students took part in a poetry workshop on the Holocaust.

Students read and discussed poems by Lotte Kramer, who lives in Peterborough. She survived the Holocaust during the Second World War, as she took part in the Kindertransport from Germany 1939. When she left the station in 1939, that was the last time she saw any of her family as they all perished in the Holocaust.

Students read Lotte's poems, which focused on her life in England and her memories of her family. Students worked very well with John Hucklesby and Brian Keegan who helped with the poetry analysis. The next stage in the project is for the students to present a piece of work for the Holocaust Memorial Day in January next year.
