



## Pre-Public Exams

Next Monday, Years 11, 12 and 13 begin these practice exams, often referred to as Mocks. The aim is to allow the students to experience the exams as they will be in the summer. This is more important than ever this year as we have new exams in some subjects, most notably English and Maths GCSE. Over the next few years the government is changing most subjects to end of course exams only, which means more written papers and less coursework. For these new courses we do not have last year's papers to use as a guide so there is a degree of uncertainty, but we have some sample papers to use and hope that the students get as accurate an experience as possible.

In recent years we have then had a Results Day for Year 11 and a Parents Evening the same day. We are doing so again this year, on 10 January, but extending this to Years 12 and 13.
