## School Performance Tables

These were published yesterday. Although we see our own entry the day before we cannot see how other schools have performed so I am writing this without that knowledge. However, these tables are often very similar to the draft ones that we saw in October so I am optimistic that we have remained second in the city for GCSE results. This is using the Progress 8 measure that was introduced last year and by which schools are now ranked. This shows how effective we are at ensuring that our students make progress that is above national progress, and we know that we were in the top 20% of schools nationally in 2017.

We are still in a process of annual changes and so this year's tables cannot be directly compared to last year's. This is mainly because of the introduction of new GCSE courses in English and Maths. The same will happen next year and the following year, so only then should a stable situation return.

Sixth Form tables are also published tomorrow and show very pleasing value added scores: 0.16 for A level only and 0.68 for Applied General (vocational) courses. As with GCSE, 0 would indicate performance in line with other students nationally.

Many students have completed expressions of interest and the NCS returned at lunchtime today to speak to students individually. The total cost of the programme is more than £1500 per student, however students who sign up this week only have to pay £25. The programme is free for any students in receipt of free school meals.
