Progress 8

I am delighted to announce that our provisional Progress 8 figure was released yesterday and it is 0.60. This means that students at St John Fisher make more than half a grade more progress on average across eight subjects at GCSE than other pupils nationally. A score of 0.60 also puts us in the 'Well above average' category and in the top 15% of all state schools in England for Progress 8. Well done to all staff and students for their hard work.

More information on the Progress 8 measure from the Department for Education:

Progress 8 scores shows how much progress pupils made between the end of key stage 2 and the end of key stage 4, compared to pupils across England who got similar results at the end of key stage 2. This is based on results in up to 8 qualifications, which include English, Maths, 3 English Baccalaureate qualifications including Sciences, Computer Science, History, Geography and Languages, and 3 other additional subjects. A score above zero means pupils made more progress, on average, than pupils across England who got similar results at the end of Key Stage 2. A score below zero means pupils made less progress, on average, than pupils across England who got similar results at the end of Key Stage 2.

The second week of exams will be straight after half term which gives students an excellent opportunity for intensive revision over the half term break.

Free School Meals

Are you eligible for free school meals? This saves families around £400 a year and gives £900 (per child) of additional funding to their school.

Your child will be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit) and an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- If you are supported under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after your employment finishes or after you start to work less hours per week.
