



## Armistice Day

Thank you to the Cadets and all who organised the remembrance parade and commemoration ceremony on Armistice Day on Wednesday of this week. It was a smaller event than in previous years due to the social distancing required but nevertheless went very well and allowed us to reflect on those who gave their lives for others in war and conflict. After a prayer led by our Chaplain, Mrs Goodfellow, Kaiden read a poem about *Flanders Field*. Students across school watched videos our cadets had prepared and reflected on the remembrance thoughts prepared by Mrs Goodfellow. We held two minutes silence across school, which was followed by playing *The Last Post* and the laying of wreaths of poppies next to the flag.

## Masks

We have received new guidance from the government around the wearing of masks. We already have a well-established system in school with wearing masks in communal areas and are delighted that students have fully engaged with this and have taken responsibility for the safety of our community. The new guidance means that students must wear a mask that fits tightly over their face. This means that students need to secure their mask to ensure it does not fall down and is not loose on their face. It will also not be possible for students to wear plastic visors or plastic face shields, which have a gap between the shield and the skin.

We will be reminding students about this, but parental support is always very welcome. If you could also provide a plastic bag for your student to keep their mask in while they are in lessons that will also support the hygienic removal of masks. We would also remind students that if they are wearing reusable masks they do need to wash them!

## The CCF Remembers

Remembrance Day is a key moment in the CCF calendar, as the nation pauses and commemorates the members of the armed forces who have died in conflict. While the activities of our contingent have been limited due to COVID restrictions, our cadets were still keen to participate in some way.

Our NCOs prepared a video and some slides for tutor briefing, explaining about Remembrance and why it is so meaningful. These were shown to all students on Wednesday morning. Our NCOs also planned a smaller version of our usual parade.



The parade assembled in the courtyard at 10.45 and our Chaplain, Mrs Goodfellow led us in prayer. Kaiden Pereira read a poem, *In Flanders Fields* and we then observed the 2 minutes silence. Following that Mrs Pereira and two NCOs laid wreaths and the parade was dismissed. Thank you to everyone who took great pains to ensure that this important day was commemorated appropriately.
