Dear Parent / Guardian

I am writing in response to the Prime Minister's announcement of another national lockdown. The implications of this is the vast majority of students will be working remotely. Even though the internet has great benefits it also carries with it risks as well.

The majority of the work set for students in Years 7-9 is on Microsoft Teams either through their own individual class Microsoft Team or through the Student W Drive on Microsoft Teams.

Year 10-13 students will mainly be pre-recorded Microsoft Teams lessons also found on individual class team or live Team lessons with their Teachers. We request that all live Teams meetings should take place in a communal space in the home and that students should be appropriately dressed and not in their pyjamas.

Can I remind parents that if they have any Safeguarding concerns they should contact their child's student support officer ideally via email or Tom Reilly the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead at:
