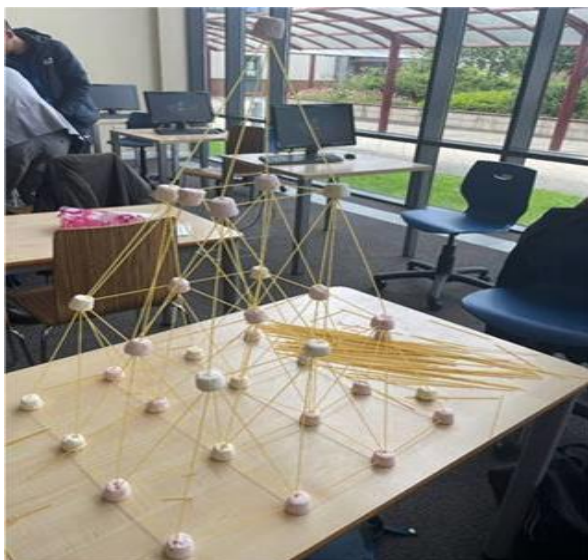
Post 18 Options Day




The Great Get Together 2021
